She has many years of experience in managing programs and projects, gained in the United Nations Development Program, the US Agency for International Development and the Bulgarian-Swiss Cooperation Program.

His professional career was in the field of finance, as an investment banker and venture capitalist in New York and Sydney, Australia (Credit Suisse, Gramercy Communications Partners, Lazard), mainly in the fields of media, telecommunications and technology.

Ivan is the co-founder and CFO of the Bulgaria Innovation Hub in San Francisco, a social enterprise that aims to support entrepreneurship in Bulgaria and facilitate the access of Bulgarian technology startups to the US market - to create a two-way bridge between the Bulgarian entrepreneurial ecosystem and Silicon Valley.

In addition to being a social entrepreneur, Ivan is an avid marathoner, CrossFit athlete and traveler.



Ewa Konczal joined EVPA in May 2014 as the Central and Eastern Europe (CEE) Manager. Ewa is spreading the knowledge about venture philanthropy and social investment in CEE.

She manages the first Polish VP Fund Valores, inititiative of PE community in Poland. Ewa has over 15 years of experience in social entrepreneurship as Representative of Ashoka in Poland and as Ashoka Director for Central and Eastern Europe.

Prior Ashoka, Ewa worked in India with Global March Against Child Labor, and in Egypt with AIESEC and Egyptian-Polish Businessman Association. She has set up the Magic Mountain Foundation, using mountain sports and natural horsemanship as tools for change for people with disadvantages.
